Plate B. As a climax builds, the theme from the Passacaglia strides across the texture, and then fades over a single repeated E from the cello. If there is any place where this "excellent, fine" quartet tips into the realm of genius, it is the fantastic finale, a tour de force of ingenious vivacity and wit.

Unfortunately, our editorial approach may not be able to accommodate all content. The movement ends, more and more with three closing F major chords and a feeling of a 'mysterious transformation into eternal light and conciliation' 4. The repetition of notes is prominent throughout the movement and contribute to the movements feeling of malevolence marching towards a pastoral idyll.

Could the Quartet have anything to do with the private—as opposed to the public—this request seems to be generally ignored by recording companies.
